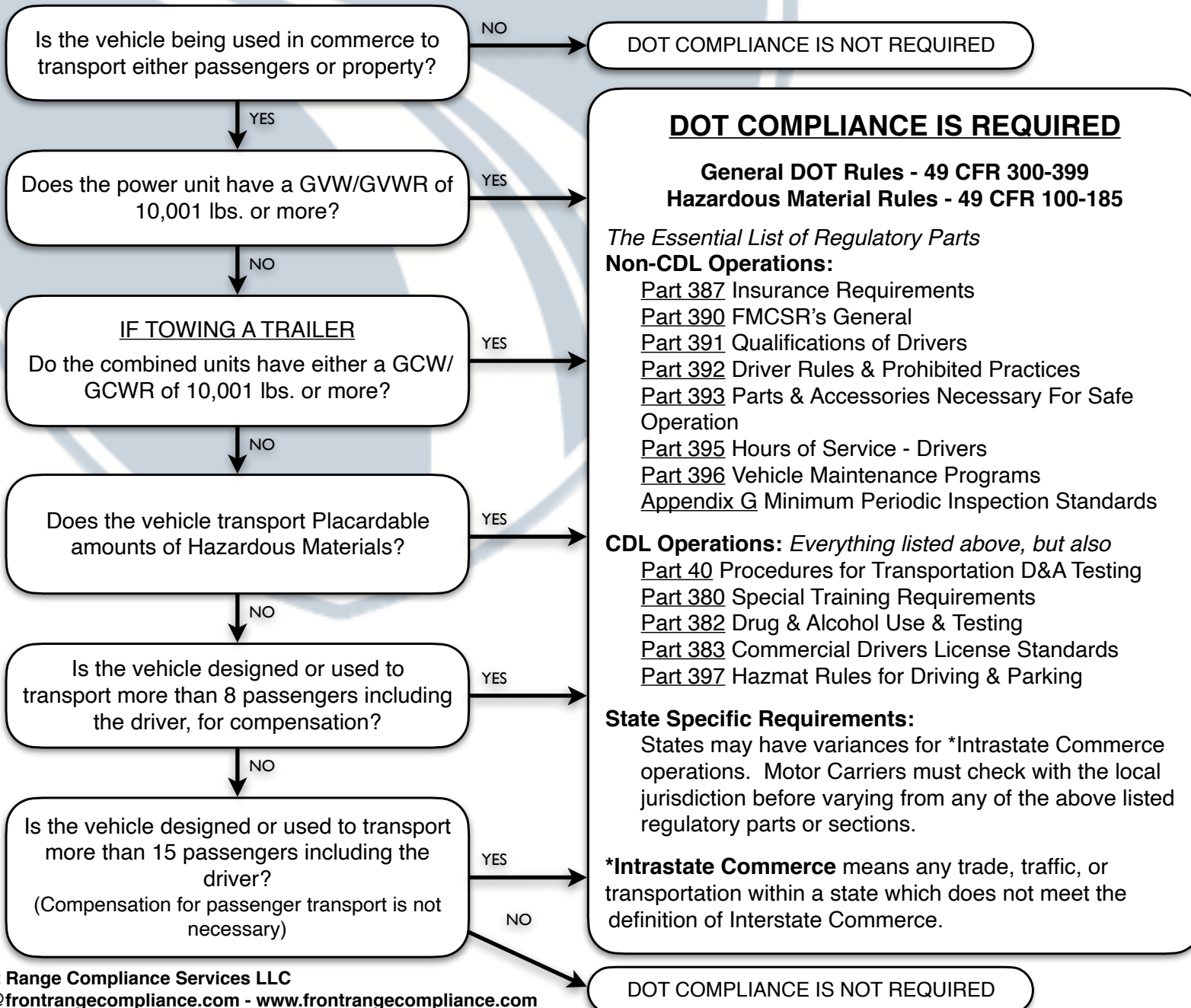

State Specific Requirements:

States may have variances for *Intrastate Commerce operations. Motor Carriers must check with the local jurisdiction before varying from any of the above listed regulatory parts or sections.

***Intrastate Commerce** means any trade, traffic, or transportation within a state which does not meet the definition of Interstate Commerce.
